SEA Flexible Learning Program

On February 9, 2012, Georgia's Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA) Flexibility Waiver was approved by the U.S. Department of Education (US ED). The waiver allows local educational agencies (LEAs) greater flexibility in designing a Flexible Learning Program (FLP). The FLP is an alternative supplemental academic intervention that allows flexibility in designing an extended learning program, tailored to the needs of academically at-risk students in a school in order to provide assistance for students to achieve proficiency in relation to the State Academic content standards.
